- Regional Convention 'Our nurses our future': Held in Dunedin last year on 18th July with an attendance of 54 members, speakers presentations were about nurse retention vs attrition, IQN to RN project and being a student in a cost-of-living crisis. Evaluations feedback was positive, everyone seemed to enjoy the day and speakers were interesting.
- Te Tai Tonga Nursing Graduation Badge: Changes were made to the badge with the wording on the back of the badge selected by last years third-year nursing students: Te Manawanui Nahi - Persevering Nurse. Badges were presented at Otago Polytechnic, Te Pūkenga celebration ceremony in Novembers and the Southern Institute of Technology award ceremony in December.
- Te Tai Tonga Matariki Dinner, Invercargill: 40 members attended the dinner organised by our Te Poari Komiti representative, Charleen Waddell, and local helpers.
- Regional Council Stalls: Stalls were held at Thieves Alley market day in February and at the South Dunedin Festival in March with an interactive session asking the public to prioritise 4 health issues we selected and collected signatures for the 'reverse the announced cuts to the new Dunedin Hospital' petition. Over 22,000 signatures have been collected. The DCC also gathered signatures.
- Celebrating Nursing: Regional council held a dinner on 12 May at Parcels (Distinction Hotel), and contributed to morning tea celebrations at different workplaces.
- NZNO 2023 AGM/Conference: Regional council sent a delegation of 15 representatives.
- Otago 2023 Polyfest, Dunedin: Our regional council held a stall at Otago Polyfest in September promoting nursing as a career to our 'young people'.
- Murihiku Hui, 31 October, Invercargill: A successful dinner for delegates and members was organised by Invercargill delegates. Paul Goulter and Anne Daniels from NZNO spoke.
- Services to NZNO Award: Te Tai Tonga/SRC presented Charleen Waddell with this award to acknowledge the incredible mahi she does supporting NZNO members and staff in her role.
- Membership Committee Representation: Expressions of interest for this position were called for twice by Te Tai Tonga/Southern Regional Council last year, with no responses both times. There is still a vacancy for this position. If anyone is interested, please let me know.

All of this is possible because of the amazing members that have given up their time to man stalls at the market days, who have assisted with the planning of regional events and the effort that went into the design and execution of the badges for our graduate nurses. We really appreciate all the members have done and continue to do.
