And then the ward round comes and I ask myself have I done enough? are these lines labelled, is my bedside straight? but can we be too tough, on one another and ourselves? They call nurses "Angels", but my wings are long singed from holding too tight to Dear Nightingale's lamp, but I carry on because I will it, and because i can, Because I've seen eyes open after weeks without sedation, while family rallies behind a young man with such determination as he takes his first steps for the second time in his life. We are not Saints We are not Angels I will never cause miracles at handover But I'll give them my mind, my hands, my words until my best is enough, no more.
