#### Scope of practice review:

Nursing Council NZ and the design team have been working hard on getting the Scope of Practice review finalised. The competencies went to the NCNZ Board meeting end of October and got approved without any further amendments. These have now been published on the NCNZ website along with the Gazette notice. Implementation of the Standards of Competence will be: 20 January 2025 New Scopes will come into effect.

- 1 April 2025 New Standards of Competence for continuing competence audit requirements come into effect.
- 1 January 2026 New Standards of Competence come into effect for all other purposes.

There will be information, Guidance and resources posted on the NCNZ website over the next few months.

#### Regional Enrolled Nurses section study days:

Canterbury, Te Tai Tokerau/Northland and Greater Wellington regions held study days throughout 2024 and although numbers weren't as high as usual, they still reported back that they were a success. We look forward to hearing about regional Study Days planned for 2025.

#### Conference 2024:

Conference in May 2024, held in Hamilton at The Verandah, Hamilton Lake was a great success. # **Enrolled nursing students sit exams**

Taranaki recommenced Enrolled Nurse Training in July 2023, and 17 students sat their exams on 20 November.

The next intake began in July this year, and these students will be the first new grads to only work under the new scope of practice when they graduate in November 2025.

Enrolled Nurse training was stopped in New Plymouth in the late '80s/early '90s, so it is very exciting to know that we now have new graduates in the province.

Te Whatu Ora Health New Zealand will have ENSIPP positions but are unable to provide how many as they are dependent upon FTE availability.
