Education in Region

EN training at Northtec, has two training intakes a year. The beginning of this year there were 25 students, and the demand for EN student placements are high.

I have been attending the NorthTec Advisory Group meetings, NDHB - PDRP Advisory Group meetings. NDHB, monthly Nursing Governance, meetings.

My special focus as an EN NZNO National Committee member was in advocating for Kaupapa Maori, and Mental Health Services.

I will stand from the National NZNO Committee on the 1st of June, as I feel I have pushed the EN training into reality in Northland and this was my main goal.

I have put in 4-5 years of voluntary work with NZNO, taken my own annual leave on many an occasion in order to make/met appointments and travel needs, and now I hope that someone will step up to commit some further voluntary work as the Chairperson for Northland.

Covid-19 has not helped the last two years, and this has made things more difficult to navigate.

Last year I completed an Auckland University Post Graduate Certificate in Health Sciences in Alcohol and Drug Studies and this year was accepted into the Masters Programme with Auckland University, this will be keeping me busy for the next few years.

Education in Region

Currently we are in discussions around planning a study day for later in the year at the Ko Awatea Lecture Theatre, Middlemore Hospital.

Manukau Institute of Technology (MIT)

Enrolled nurse (EN) Section committee member, Dorothy Browning was asked to do a ZOOM presentation on the EN role in acute care to EN students at MIT.

Waitemata DHB

EN's in outpatient clinics have now returned to their areas of work after helping on the wards through the COVID surge.

The ENSIPP at Waitemata DHB currently has only one new graduate EN on the programme.

Since the programme commenced in 2020 five EN's began the programme, three completed it last year with one currently due to complete the course in November. Unfortunately, one left not long after commencing.

EN positions are currently being advertised in theatre and on the bureau.

Counties Manukau DHB

Orthopaedics have decided not to employ EN's to fill vacancies, which is a blow for enrolled nurses wanting to have a career in this area.

Dorothy attended a ZOOM meeting that all nurses working in the surgical services were invited to. The surgical services managers discussed the need to plan for the next COVID wave and flu season, on top of the many vacancies across surgical services that have not been filled.

They discussed thinking outside the square and the possibility of having a pharmacist helping to administer medications.

Dorothy asked about the employment of EN's in surgical services and was disappointed with their short sightedness, so she also followed up with an email outlining her frustrations with surgical services.

Auckland DHB

COVID 19 has surely put pressure on all departments within the DHB with many nurses being pooled to task in areas requiring extra help due to increased hospital admissions, staff being off sick (mostly due to COVID and fatigue), staff shortages and staff resigning. It is still a stressful and uncertain time across the departments.

Our ward staff, RN's, EN's and HCA's at Greenlane Clinical Centre, continue to support Auckland Hospital nurses, however with our elective lists starting to increase again, we are hoping that things will begin to return to our new normal and that we will no longer be pooled as it has been very unsettling for staff not being sure if they are working on our ward or being once again pooled to an unfamiliar area.

Our ward also assisted by doing extra infusions for transplant patients for a few weeks, this was to help lighten the then increasing workload at Auckland City Hospital.

Many 1st, 2nd and 3rd year students are now coming through our department for placements, after the backlog due to COVID lockdowns. I continue to precept students and am also kept busy writing up feedback for both RN students and the enrolled nurses in my workplace.

In correspondence with Hayden Erick, Nurse Educator – Enrolled nursing and student placement ADHB, of the eight enrolled nurses in the 2020 ENSIPP, five completed their portfolio and graduated from the programme, one continued to work and then under the guidance of her manager completed her portfolio and one returned recently from maternity leave and is currently working on hers, while one left nursing, due to personal reasons.

There were seven enrolled nurses in the November 2021 ENSIPP intake with one more joining in March 2022.

For both these intakes they could not fill all the available vacancies. They contacted every candidate on the ACE list, also offering interviews for some that weren't in the Auckland catchment.

For the March 2022 intake, 4 positions were available, but they were only able to recruit one person. This was due mostly to limited candidates in ACE, not being able to work inpatient rosters and not wanting to move to Auckland.

The feedback he received is that most enrolled nurses go straight into aged care or private health providers and don't go into ACE. Also, it appeared some candidates did not understand the need for ACE to be recruited into a DHB.

At the end of last year, they had recruitment sessions and meet and greet with MIT enrolled nursing students and advised them about the ACE process. This year they have met twice with MIT students.

He said due to the change of enrolled nurses being able to enter ACE before getting their state results has reduced the timeline from graduation to employment.

2022 semester one, 30 student enrolled nurse placements have been confirmed with the same numbers for semester two.

Greater Auckland / Tamaki Makaurau Regional Council had a meeting via Zoom on the 6th April. Unfortunately, due to work commitments I was unable to attend. In the minutes it was mentioned that it is a good initiative to complete the enrolled nurse programme if unable to continue on the RN programme.

It was stated that there is a wider group looking at the nationally aligned programme and see EN as a destination.

An EN commented that she completed the EN programme, because at the time she had family commitments and now she wants to do more but there is no option to transition from the EN level without having to do the whole three years of RN training. She emphasised the need for a bridging programme to be actioned sooner rather than later.

In Closing

With another year of our new normal moving forwards, all putting one foot in front of the other and simply getting the job done, we can say with all certainty that nurses are truly resilient and at this time we are also seeing progress with enrolled nursing moving into areas that in the past have been hard to access and our next generation of EN's are doing well and being accepted in the work environment, which is definitely something to be proud of. We have gone from being replaced by HCA's to being reinstated into our rightful roles and EN's.

Thank you to the Auckland EN Section committee for being a bunch of amazing woman whom I am tremendously blessed to work alongside and I value each and every one of you for your commitment to the EN's in the Auckland region and we welcome one new member to the committee.

To all the members of the national EN committee, thank you for the tremendous work that you all do behind the scenes.

We welcome the new chairperson and committee members for 2022 and for those that are staying on and those that are stepping down thank you for all your efforts and last but not least, to Suzanne you have made a big difference to enrolled nursing in NZ and we appreciate your continued support.

Otago Polytechnic is commencing a further NZ Diploma in Enrolled Nursing in July 2022, which is great news.

Southern DHB are advertising for New Graduate Enrolled Nurses at Dunedin and Invercargill Hospitals, in the following areas:

Dunedin Hospital- Surgical wards (3 B & C, 4C, 4A), Medical Wards, Assessment, Treatment and Rehabilitation (including Pua Wai) and Mental Health, Addiction, and Intellectual Disability Services **Invercargill Hospital**- Surgical ward, Perioperative Service, Medical Wards and Assessment, Treatment and Rehabilitation ward.

Enrolled Nurse positions continue to be advertised across the region in community settings. We have one enrolled nurse who has been employed in a mental health and addiction position in a primary health care setting

Education in Region:

Otago Polytechnic - 15 sitting state in July

1 sitting state in December

24 Full time students started in February 6 Part timers repeating courses from 2021.

Otago Polytechnic are about to open applications for a July intake of minimum of 10 students as there was such overwhelming interest in the programme at the start of the year.

The government's decision to continue with including NZ DIP EN in its Apprenticeship funding – meaning first year fees free has been a total game changer for our applicants. Many of whom could not afford the \$8.500 fees.

DHB recruitment and ENSIPP team have presented to the July finalists – promoting the many vacancies for EN grads which is awesome. Most have already got their applications in – pending their state final-results.

I am presenting to the Otago Polytechnic students via teams on the 1^{st of} June 2022, and to Southland Institute of Technology (SIT) enrolled nurse students on the 8^{th of} August. The NZNO professional Nursing Adviser is also presenting that day at SIT on Direction and Delegation, NCNZ Code of Conduct and Professional Boundaries.

Southland Institute of Technology were commencing 2022 with approximately 25 enrolled nurse students.

Southern Region Enrolled Nurse Section are working towards having a study day in Dunedin, in October 2022.

Covid has been making a real impact in the Southern Region, with wards at Dunedin and Invercargill Hospitals closed, staff affected and nursing shortages impacting as well. Our rural hospitals are also affected.
