

What PHARMAC is and isn't

PHARMAC isn't a...

- Medicine supplier (pharmaceutical companies)
- Fund holder (DHBs hold the budget)
- Regulator or safety agency (Medsafe)
- Supply chain (pharmacists and pharmacy wholesalers)
- Manager of drug trials (pharmaceutical companies/research institutes)

PHARMAC is the...

- Subsidy agency
- National contract negotiator and contract manager
- Budget manager

PHARMAC is a crown agency of 130 staff, Wellington based

PHARMAC provides funded access to pharmaceuticals for all New Zealanders










Te Wero-Inequity in Māori access to medicines 2006/07

Pou kōtahi - advance tino rangatiratanga with whānau in health interventions


Pou tuarua - establish and maintain authentic strategic connections




