150 YEARS AGO!

In 1869, Irish scientist Mary Ward was riding in a steam-powered automobile built by her cousins. As they rounded a bend in the road, Ward was thrown from her seat and fell in the vehicle's path. One of the wheels rolled over her and broke her neck, killing her instantly.



In 1896, Bridget Driscoll a mother of two young girls, stepped off of a London curb and was struck and killed by a gaspowered Anglo-French model car driven by Arthur Edsall, who not only drove the car too fast, but was also talking to his female passenger beside him instead of watching the road. While the car had a top speed of four miles per hour, neither Edsall nor Driscoll—who witnesses described as "bewildered" by the sight of the vehicle and frozen in place—were able to avoid the collision. Edsall was arrested, but the death was ruled an accident and he was not prosecuted. The coroner who examined Driscoll's body is famously quoted as saying that he hoped "such a thing would never happen again."
